#### Introducing New Building Leadership Team

#### Mr. Lloyd Knight, Princiapal

Llovd Knight began his career as a student teacher and has worked at nearly every level including classroom teacher, curriculum resource teacher and assistant principal. In his time at CICS Lloyd Bond, they achieved breakthrough growth in reading and math through the implementation of Daily 5, Math Daily 3, and a rigorous independent reading program. In two years CICS Lloyd Bond went from the closed list to the 4th Best Charter Elementary School in the City of Chicago according to Chicago Magazine. As the Lead Principal of NC for Charter Schools USA, he spearheaded the expansion of five new buildings and the largest portfolio of charter schools in the state of North Carolina. Lloyd Knight's journey then took him to Indianapolis' Thomas Carr Howe Community High School. At the beginning, it was the longest failing school in Indiana history. Through the implementation of The Academy Model they improved attendance and improved the overall culture but starting the day with what students' love. Additionally, we graduated over 90% of students in consecutive years but raised expectations and built strong bonds with community partners to assist. After two years, TC Howe left the closed list and finished with a "C" grade of the state report card. At Charles A Tindley Accelerated School, Mr. Knight led our school to the continued success they have experienced through the years. College or Die is the mantra and our students lived up to it daily. With a 100% graduation rate, \$14,000,000 in scholarships, and 100% of students graduating to four-year universities, we were the guiding light of excellence within Indianapolis. Mr. Knight is a trained peacekeeper, holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in elementary education from Shaw University in North Carolina, and earned his Master of Arts degree in education leadership from DePaul University in Chicago.

#### Mrs. Maria Cortez, Community Liaison/ Administrator

Maria Elizabeth Cortez has a passion for advocating for underserved communities to bridge the gap in services. She does this daily through her work. Her career in direct services has included the YMCA of Central Ohio, working as a Community Liaison for Educational Academy for Boys and Girls, Community Project Manager for Mount Carmel Outreach and a Community Health Worker Instructor at The Ohio State University College of Nursing. These experiences have set Maria up for success, as she brings a unique perspective into the needs of the community. Originally from El Salvador and a first-generation immigrant in New Jersey, she currently resides in North Columbus with her husband and daughter. She earned a Bachelor's of Social Work degree from the Universidad de El Salvador and received her Community Health Worker certification from The Ohio State University.
